1-2-3-4 Beat

Follow the rhythm of your own heartbeat and learn some quick and easy ways to add drums and other rhythm instruments to your story time.



Voice

No matter what you think you sound like, most people can sing. Make your voice go up and down in pitch when you are singing. Think of the three bears. Papa Bear with a deep voice, Mama Bear with a medium voice, Baby Bear with a high voice. Variety is the key.

Dynamics

Music has natural opposites to make it interesting to listen to. Use them to make your songs more interesting. Fast and slow, high and low, loud and soft, short and long.



Books That Are Songs

Use books that are songs as a guide for improvisation. I like "Down By the Station" with lots of transportation vehicles, then we sing it and move around the room like each vehicle. Find the rhythm in your beloved children's stories. Sing a book that is a classic children's song, a fun way to add some musical spice to story time.



Move
